



I am not very good at asking for help. It has been a flaw of mine as far back as I can remember and as such, I am not very good at thanking people, and I really want to get this right. How does one go about thanking a group of people that took it upon themselves, see part where I am not good at asking for help, to support you and your family in what has been one of the hardest moments in your life? I do not know but I can tell you a story about our house. Both my wife and I grew up in Mt.Baldy and have very deep roots there. Which is why we decided it was where we wanted to raise our family. It is a very small town, and the houses do not go up for sale very often, so we felt very fortunate when we got the opportunity to purchase one in the village. When we were moving in, we noticed inside one of the kitchen cabinets where a few proverbs and inspirational guotes that were printed on little strips of paper and tapped to the backside of the cabinet. My wife and I both saw them as we loaded our own plates into the cabinet for the first time, and thought they were nice and left them where they were. For almost 11 years those little strips of paper hung onto the back wall as we unloaded and loaded our plates for countless family meals. I had seen them so many times that only occasionally would they register on my conscious mind. They had become one of many unique little features that made up what now had become a true family home. One of those notes in particular comes to mind for me right now while trying to express my gratitude. It was a single line from a poem that I am sure many of you have read before. The poem is called foot prints in the sand and speaks of someone that is dreaming of walking down a beach with God and sees that there are two sets of foot prints matching up with memories from their life, except at the hardest moments where there are only one set of footprints and that is when the person turns to god and ask why at the hardest parts of my life are there only one set of foot prints and God responds, "It was at those times I carried you." That is the phrase that has been hanging around in the back of our cabinet and that is how I feel now. That all of you wonderful souls are carrying me and my family through a very difficult time. The kindness and generosity you have all shown is truly amazing and the only words I can come up with are Thank You.


